Summary	The paper presents the results of the survey "Territorial network for occupational integration of disadvantaged people" carried out in Campania as part of the project Isfol "Programme for support and development of integrated schemes for socio-occupational integration of subjects with psychic disorder" (Pro.P). The research, developed through the identification of a sample of public and private subjects considered to be possible actors of a regional network, is aimed at verifying the existence of a real cooperation between different subjects and related services, of possible strengths, as well as problems and critical issues that hinder the employment of disadvantaged individuals, particularly with mental disorders. The complexity of needs of disadvantaged people requires a coordinated action and cooperation between multiple actors such as Employment Centres (CPI), Social Planning Offices, Local Health Authority (ASL), Local Authorities, Trade Unions, who work to build up an integrated system of social interventions and services. In this sense it is necessary to develop appropriate social policies which are able to build up services networks on the territory to promote citizenship' rights of people with disabilities and in particular with psychic disorder. Main Conclusions (in bullets)	<ul> <li>The bodies and services involved in the process must develop the ability and capacity to establish formal networks. These networks must include Mental Health services, non-profit organisations, job centres, cooperatives, associations of employers, education providers.</li> <li>There's a critical lack of conditions necessary to make interventions last beyond the funding obtained.</li> <li>Until we obtain a desired and real, equal opportunity to enter and stay in the world of work, non-profit organizations remain crucial for integration of people with MH, for the many difficulties inherent in mental illness and in the enormous complexity of the current labor market.</li> </ul>
